Vocabulary. The family

uncle aunt brother sister cousin son daughter father mother parents nephew niece grandchild grandfather/mother grandparent(s) granddaughter/son great-grandchild husband wife ex-husband ex-wife in-laws son-in-law, etc. step-father, step-daughter, etc. half-brother, half-sister twin-sister/brother

Possessive "'s"

You place 's after the possessor, then the possessed object.

Albert's house (La casa de Albert)
Diana's favourite books. (Los libros favoritos de Diana)

You only add ' when nouns are plural or end in -s.

The boys' room. James' girlfriend.

When the possessors are 2 or more people, you place 's after the second one.

Tim and Bob's sisters. (Tim and Bob are brothers)

Notice the difference: Tim's and Bob's sisters. (Tim and Bob both have sisters, but they are not brothers)

You use 's/ s' when the possessor is a person, animal, country, company or organization, and after certain time expressions.

Suzanne's suitcase.
The dog's food.
Spain's biggest partner.
IBM's factory in Ireland.
Today's papers / 2 weeks' sick leave.
